Principles

- Children and adults have the right to be respected
- Good discipline is best promoted by purposeful learning and example
- Unacceptable behaviour can be changed

Aims

- Good adult and peer role-models of caring co-operative behaviour.
- Reinforcement of positive attitudes to expectations.
- Recognition and promotion of a wide range of achievement.
- Acceptance of a common responsibility for maintaining good discipline and promoting the school's basic guidelines.

Guidelines

- In our school, everyone is expected to show courtesy and consideration for others, for the school and for the wider community.

Rights

- We all have a right to the opportunity of a good education.
- We all have the right to be treated respectfully, fairly and with understanding
- We all have the right to have our property respected.
- We all have the right to a safe, pleasant, clean and well-maintained environment.

Responsibilities

- We all have a responsibility to behave well in class, bring the correct equipment, keep up-to-date with homework, attend school, be punctual and uphold the school rules.
- We all have a responsibility to respect the rights of others and to treat others with respect, understanding, truthfulness and fairness.
- We all have a responsibility not to steal, damage or destroy the property of others and to treat other people's property with respect and care.
- We all have a responsibility not to smoke, take alcoholic drinks or drugs or influence others to do so.
- We all have a responsibility to care for the school environment and keep it clean. We should not do anything which may threaten or endanger others and should report any actions or situations which we perceive as such.
- We all have a responsibility to behave in such a way that the community will respect our school and should wear the school uniform correctly.
